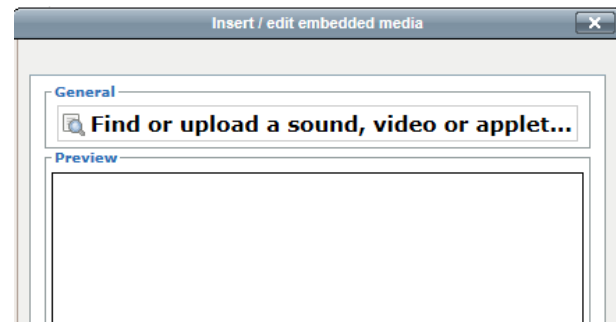
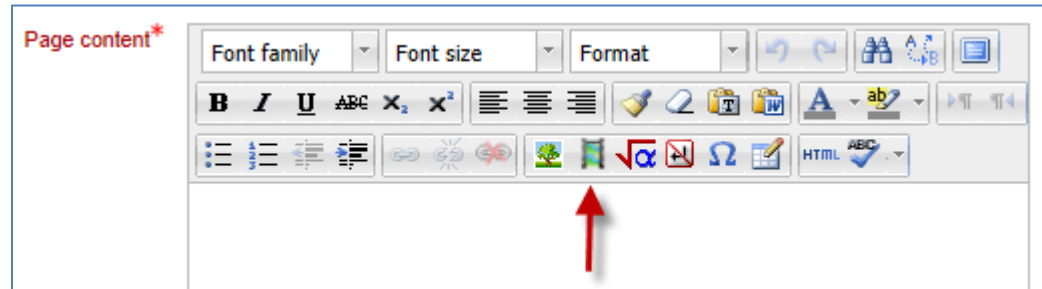
Moodle 2 – Embedding YouTube Videos

	<p>This tutorial begins with the instructor already logged into Moodle. http://moodle.lattc.edu</p> <p>This tutorial refers to the Faculty Quick Guide to Moodle 2.</p>
	<p>The navigation menu is shown to the left with options to click on Site Pages, My Profile and My courses. When you click on My Courses, the courses to which you are enrolled as student, non-editing teacher or teacher will be displayed. Clicking on the links will display items lower in the structure and clicking on it a second time collapses the list.</p>
<p>a) </p> <p>b) </p> <p>1. </p>	<p>The upper right corner of the navigation menu has a central bar that divides the hide/show option on the left and the command to dock the menu on the right. Notice the difference between image a) and b) to the left. Image a) has a minus sign and matches the Navigation menu image above it. That indicates the Navigation menu displays items.</p> <p>Clicking on the minus sign hides the list of items and the right corner turns to a + sign. See image c) for two collapsed menus.</p> <p>Each of the menus that appear on the left and right of the center primary Moodle window operate in the same fashion.</p>
	<p>Click on the words My Courses after you log into Moodle and click on your development course to practice these skills. Your development course has your name with _Dev after it.</p>

	<p>Locate the Turn Editing On button in the top right corner and click on it. This will reveal the instructor features that will permit you to add pages for this tutorial.</p>
	<p>Click on the arrow at the right and the drop down menu appears.</p>
	<p>Select the PAGE option from the “Add A Resource” menu in the unit where you want the students to watch the YouTube video.</p>
<p>Completing the New Page Form</p>	<p>Enter the Name of the Link to appear on the course home page. Example: <i>Video: LATTC First Year Experience Program</i>. Enter the description that will appear on the course resource page.</p> 

Embed the video

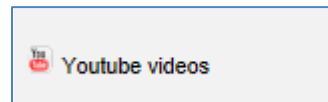
In the Page Contents box, locate and click on the Moodle Media icon.



Click on the words FIND OR UPLOAD A SOUND, VIDEO OR APPLET...

The File Picker pops up next.

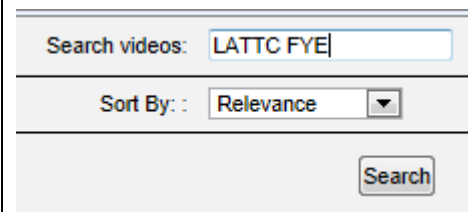
Locate and click on the YouTube Videos options on the left.



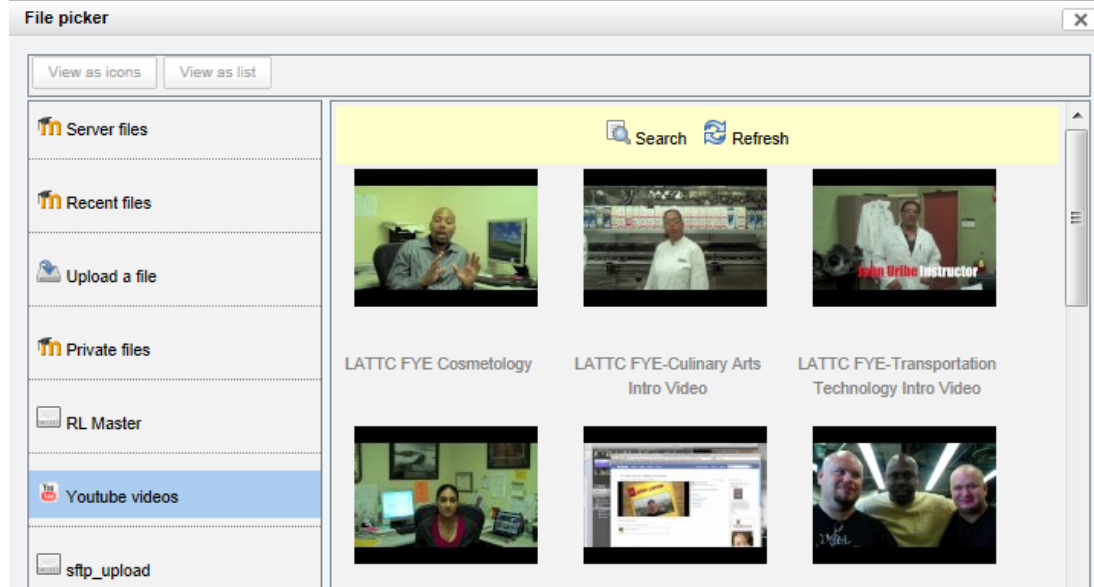
Search for YouTube Videos

In the right part of that File Picker pop-up window the option to search YouTube videos will appear. Enter your search text and then click on the SEARCH button. You can also use the drop down menu to search by relevance, date, etc.

Example of searching for LATTC First Year Experience videos:



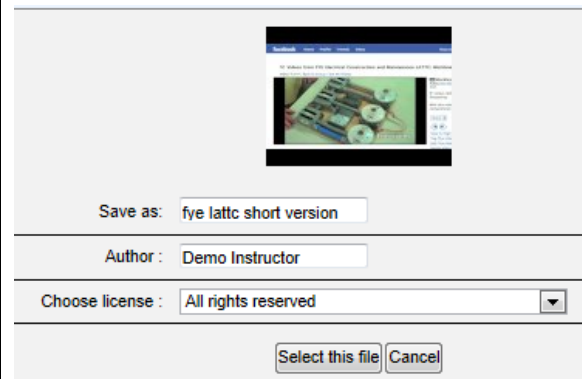
Select the YouTube Video you want or change your search criteria and search again.



If you see the video you want, just click on it to select it.

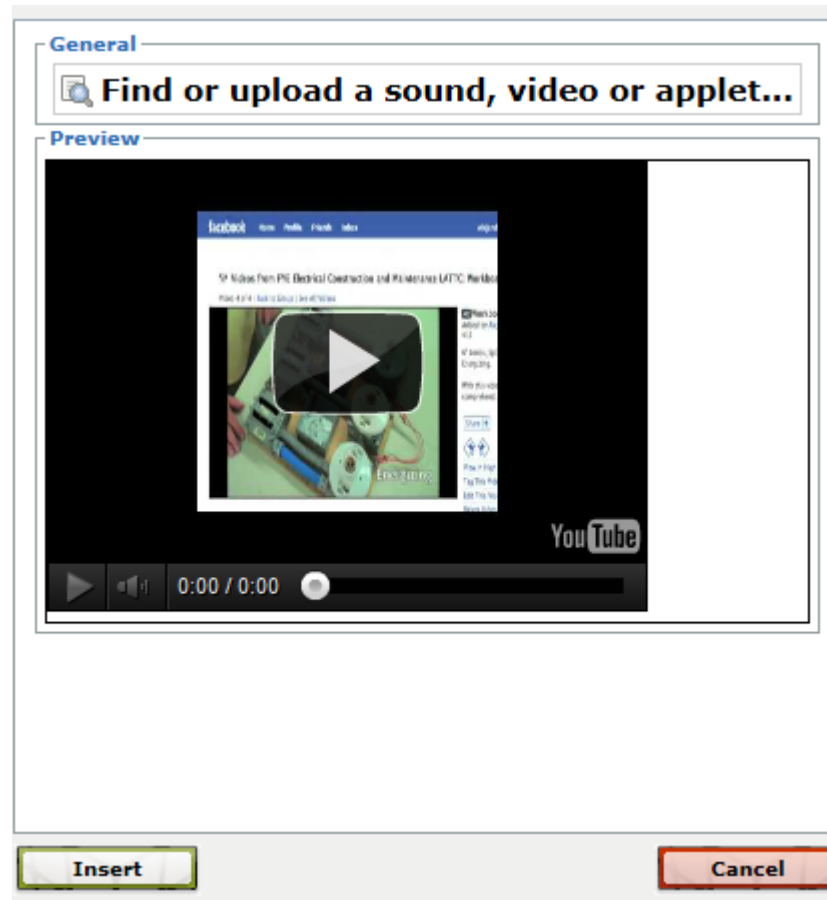
Confirm your video selection to embed

Select the option that best fits the copyrights. Click Select this File.



Insert Image

Wait for the video to appear in the INSERT/EMBED MEDIA menu.



Then click the button INSERT.

When you return to the Page form you won't see the video. You will see the name appearing as a link in the Content box.

Complete the Page Form Options

Select the rest of the options you want for that page.

Be sure to go to the bottom and click the SAVE AND DISPLAY button.

	<p>If asked about displaying secure content, go ahead and confirm it. This is a browser/user dependent factor that won't happen to all users on all computers.</p> <p>You can embed YouTube videos in labels on the home page of the class but if you put more than one or two, the page gets long and can take a very long time to load. It is best to embed videos as links. If you like them on the home page, then display them for the duration of the lesson and then change them to links and display the next video as a label. This changes the course home page and keeps students from experiencing the SCROLL OF DEATH or the aggravation of waiting for ever for a course page to load.</p>
